All six graduates have a renewed hope for a better future. Their trajectory has changed dramatically thanks to the progress made at the James E. Davis on-grounds school.

According to Principal Jim Stuart, "When youth arrive at the Children's Home, some are behind academically five to six grades. Again, I give so much credit to our outstanding teaching staff. We continue to see a growing number of youth graduating from our program. The six graduates were able to make outstanding progress both educationally and behaviorally."


A Twenty-One Year Tradition

Buck Creek United Methodist Ladies Missionary Society and the congregation have a twenty-one year tradition of donating socks to the Home during the Christmas season. According to Nancy Schnepp, long-time organizer of the sock drive, 13,224 pairs of socks have been donated during the two-decade period. Socks are donated in memory of members of their congregation who have passed away during the year.

"In 2001, it was decided to pick one item that would be easy for all of our members to collect and socks were the answer. It makes us feel so good to be able to donate the socks. It is our hope that each resident at the Home feels blessed with each pair they wear," stated Nancy. She said they have already collected 25 pairs and \$115 in donations for 2022.

Vincent Van Gogh Did Not Visit Our Campus!

Take a look at this original art piece by artist Josh Bleecker of New Albany, Indiana. He was commissioned to paint a portrait of the Home's campus. The original painting hangs in the Home's administration building while prints were made for the Indiana Children's Champion Award recipients. The awards will be given yearly.

Josh's work is heavily influenced by the Post-Impressionist style of Vincent Van Gogh, so that's the style he chose to paint the image. Similar to Van Gogh, he incorporated short, individual brushstrokes throughout the canvas, particularly in the grass and trees. He also used thick applications of paint to make some areas of the image stand out from the canvas, which is called impasto. Because red is the color that the



human eye notices first, he chose to paint the brown-haired figure's shoes red to focus the viewer's attention on the two walking students who are the heart and soul of the composition. They represent the trust, security, and friendship that can be found within the Home. On their left stand the Teaching-Family homes made of brick to provide safe environments of learning and shelter. Surrounding the campus are lush patches of grass and energetic trees to remind the inhabitants of God's never-ending presence within nature.

Josh's mother and father-in-law are United Methodist pastors in Southern Indiana and he recently married Rachel Alstott who served as the Home's Spiritual Life Leader for two years.
